Nicholas A. Karacostas Unanimously Elected Supreme President

New York City Attorney to Lead Organization into its 88th Year

SAN FRANCISCO - The delegates of the American Hellenic Educational Progressive Association (AHEPA), a leading association for the nation's three million American citizens of Greek heritage, and countless Philhellenes, unanimously elected Nicholas A. Karacostas their supreme president at its 87th Annual Supreme Convention in San Francisco. Karacostas ran unopposed in elections that were held Saturday, July 4, 2009.

"Words cannot express how humbled and honored I am to be elected AHE-PA Supreme President," said Karacostas, who emigrated from Kyrenia, Cyprus as a three-year-old with his family. "It is the culmination of 30 years of service to the organization, dating back to my membership in the Sons of Pericles."

He continued, "I look forward to working with our new Supreme Lodge, and entire membership, to keep AHEPA on the steady path set forth by my predecessors. There are many challenges facing the community, and new ones will emerge. However, I'm confident we will strive to overcome them together in true spirit to our mission."

Karacostas, who hails from Flushing, N.Y., is a 25-year member of AHEPA Gus Cherevas - Estia-Pindus Chapter 326, in Flushing. He has served AHEPA in numerous leadership positions including supreme vice president, two terms as supreme counselor, and on its Board of Directors. As supreme president, Karacostas' responsibilities include being the chief executive officer, and principal spokesperson, of the entire AHEPA Domain, which includes the United States, Canada, Greece, and Cyprus.

The newly-elected supreme president was born in Kyrenia, Cyprus and immigrated to the United States three years later. Karacostas, an attorney, is the senior vice president of Arch Insurance Group. He is a member of the American Bar Association, the New York Bar Association, and National Institute for Trial Advocacy. Karacostas received his J.D. from the City of New York Law School and is a graduate of New York University.





Where do We Stand in the History and Legacy of Our Roots?

Roots that are long in history and strong in years of struggles faced and overcome.

As we in the Despora take the time to reflect on those roots, their history and their strength, we can be proud of our heritage and the legacy of our families. Our legacies may not be in the riches associated with financial gains, but they are legacies built on generation upon generation of sacrifice for the

common good: family, neighbor, community and nation.

Where do we stand in that history, in that legacy? We are faced with many horrific struggles today due to a less than stable economy, are we ready to step up to the plate for the common good? Has the land of milk and honey become the land of gluttony?
