Message from District Governor Robert Sexton

Brothers:

Things have been quiet in District 21 these last few years, but all that is about to change. January promises to be a very busy month for us. We will be finishing our course

of visitations, with six chapter visits compressed into that single month. But that is not the best part. We will be hosting a series of chapter visits from the Supreme Lodge. Our Supreme President, Dr. John Grossomanides, accompanied by the Supreme VP, Supreme Sec. and our Supreme Governor will pay visits to the Sacramento, Stockton, Modesto and Fresno chapters. That alone has to be a record. His intention is to connect the chapters with the supreme Lodge in order to promote growth in our order. The fact that he and his Lodge are coming to the district again shows that District 21 has not been forgotten.

•The Spring Conference will be hosted by Oakland AHEPA on March 16.


•The Sisterhood Conference is on April 12 - 14, in Portland, Oregon, hosted by District 22. I sent you the registration form with my December bulletin.




