### Galanis Elected Supreme President

Wisconsin Native Runs Uncontested



The delegates of the AHEPA elected John W. Galanis, Elm Grove, Wisconsin., as their supreme president at the 93rd Annual Supreme Convention, San Francisco, California. Galanis ran unopposed in elections that were held July 3, 2015. Formal installation ceremonies were held July 4, 2015.

"It is an honor and privilege to be elected AHEPA supreme president,"

Supreme President Galanis said. "My sincere appreciation is given to the convention delegates who placed their support and trust in me to lead this vibrant, venerable, and unique organization in the coming year. I am excited to work with our seasoned Supreme Lodge and our membership to keep AHEPA on the steady path set forth by my predecessors in a spirit true to our mission."

He added, "My parents were Greek immigrants, and I'm proud of my heritage and that is why I'm a member of AHEPA."

At the installation ceremony, the supreme president also discussed his goals and challenges.

"Obviously, our immediate thoughts and concerns are with the people of Greece during this most difficult and challenge time in Greece's history," he said. "Also, we aim to complete our capital fundraising campaign to help rebuild Saint Nicholas and focus our internal efforts on membership growth and retention. In addition, the community continues to face a multitude of challenges that are important to address as the need for community service is never ending, both in the United States and abroad, and the promotion of Hellenic ideals will always be a priority for AHEPA."

Galanis is a 47 year member of Chapter 43, Milwaukee, Wisconsin. He has served AHEPA in numerous leadership positions including most recently supreme vice president and on the Board of Trustees. As supreme president, Galanis' responsibilities include being the chief executive officer and principal spokesperson of the entire AHEPA domain, which includes the United States, Canada, and chapters in Europe.

The Supreme President is a founding partner of Galanis, Pollack, Jacobs & Johnson, S.C., a Milwaukee-based law firm. He is a graduate of the University of Michigan Law School and received his undergraduate degree from the University of Wisconsin at Madison. He also attended the London School of Economics. Galanis has served as president of several community and charitable organizations, including the Boys & Girls Club of Milwaukee and the Greater Milwaukee Foundation.

Galanis and his wife, Patricia, are members of Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church, Milwaukee, and have four children and several grandchildren. Galanis is an Archon of the Order of Saint Andrew the Apostle - Ecumenical Patriarchate of Constantinople.

September 11 was a national tragedy that forever changed America. Nearly 3,000 lives were lost; 39 of who were Greek Americans. Also lost that fateful day was the only House of Worship destroyed by the 9/11 attacks Saint Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church.

The effort to rebuild Saint Nicholas was mired in bureaucracy. AHEPA's "Cut the Red Tape!"" campaign proved effective in helping to budge the bureaucracy of the New York/New Jersey Port Authority to allow for the construction of Saint Nicholas at Ground Zero.

Now the time has come to build the Saint Nicholas National Shrine at World Trade Center. AHEPA and its affiliated organizations, the Daughters of Penelope, Sons of Pericles, and Maids of Athena, will support the campaign to build the Saint Nicholas National Shrine by raising funds during the next two years.




#### **AHEPA VETERANS REGISTRATION**

AHEPA Medal for Military Service is awarded to all veterans in Honor of their service to the United States.

"The Mission of the Order of AHEPA Veterans Committee is to archive and recognize all veterans of the Order and Hellenic community through sound communication and publication. Furthermore, to conduct fund raising and philanthropic outreach through a cohesive, limited, yet well defined activity that reflects well on the Order of AHEPA and brings credit to the organization at large."

The AHEPA Medal for Military Service, approved by the 106th Congress, was presented to all AHEPA veterans present at the 34th Biennial Congressional Banquet, March 29, 2000. The Supreme Lodge then encouraged its districts and chapters to present this medal to its deserving veterans unable to attend this banquet. It is this committee's intent to register AHEPA Veterans and have the AHEPA Medal presented at appropriate events at the District and Chapter levels. Funds collected through this effort cover medal production and other administrative costs to include shipping. Remaining proceeds will be donated to the Wounded Warrior Program annually.

Eligibility requirement for AHEPA Medal for Military Service includes Honorable Service and Discharge. Service includes Active Duty, National Guard, or Reserve status of the United States Armed Forces. REGISTER ONLINE AT WWW.AHEPA.ORG. File a copy with your chapter Secretary after registration is complete. Medals are normally shipped in the fall and in time for Veteran's Day celebrations in November.

# **AHEPA Participates at White House Discussion** on Greece

# **Executive Director Meets with Treasury Department Official**

WASHINGTON, DC -- The American Hellenic Educational Progressive Association (AHEPA), a leading association for the nation's millions of American citizens of Greek heritage and Philhellenes, applauds the Obama Administration's outreach to the American Hellenic community with a discussion the administration held on Greece, August 6, 2015, at the Eisenhower Executive Office Building, announced Supreme President John W. Galanis.

"AHEPA sincerely appreciates the high level of engagement by United States government officials to address the crisis in Greece and its outreach to Capitol Hill and the community on the crisis," Galanis said. "We found the discussion to be straightforward, insightful, and substantive, and the community came together to provide its thoughts and ideas on how to help Greece. AHEPA looks forward to continued discussions and stands ready to assist with the implementation of any sustainable, concrete opportunities or solutions for Greece and its people that may materialize."

According to Galanis, AHEPA raised possible policy suggestions to assist with the tourism sector and humanitarian efforts. In addition, AHEPA conveyed it was encouraged to learn about certain issue areas the administration is looking to address, in particular, migration and technical assistance to Greece.

#### **Meeting with Treasury Department**

Also this week, Executive Director Basil Mossaidis met with Lea Bouzis, director, International Affairs Office of Europe & Eurasia, U.S. Department of the Treasury, to convey in person the community's appreciation for the efforts of Treasury Secretary Jacob Lew on Greece's debt crisis. The August 5 meeting was a follow-up to a July 17, 2015 letter Supreme President John Galanis sent to Secretary Lew on the situation in Greece.

"We thank Director Bouzis for the generous amount of time she afforded us to talk about the situation in Greece," Mossaidis said. "It was an informative meeting, and we look forward to maintaining dialogue with Treasury on Greece's debt crisis.

#### **Background**

AHEPA embarked on a campaign to provide humanitarian assistance to Greece since 2012. As part of that campaign:

AHEPA has collaborated with International Orthodox Christian Charities (IOCC) to secure nine shipping containers of medical supplies which have been delivered all throughout Greece, totaling more than \$6 million in medical supply aid. Each shipping container costs between \$15,000 and \$20,000 to secure.

A tenth medical supply container is planned to be secured and sent in September.

In March 2013, AHEPA Canada donated a rigid bronchoscope machine valued at 10,000 euros (or approximately \$12,000 Canadian) to Evangelismos Hospital. The rigid bronchoscope is used to prevent lung bleeding while positioning stents in tumors.

More than \$500,000 was donated to Apostoli Mission in Athens to help feed the needy people of Greece.

Moreover, AHEPA's 31 chapters on the ground in Greece are helping their local communities through their own charitable and philanthropic initiatives and programs.

To date, the AHEPA family has raised nearly \$700,000 for humanitarian aid for the people of Greece to secure public health assistance or to help feed those in need.
















#### "Koukla's Corner"
