

# AHEPA Campaign to Build Saint Nicholas National Shrine at World Trade Center

September 11 was a national tragedy that forever changed America. Nearly 3,000 lives were lost; 39 of who were Greek Americans. Also lost that fateful day was the only House of Worship destroyed by the 9/11 attacks Saint Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church.

The effort to rebuild Saint Nicholas was mired in bureaucracy. AHEPA's "Cut the Red Tape!"" campaign proved effective in helping to budge the bureaucracy of the New York/New Jersey Port Authority to allow for the construction of Saint Nicholas at Ground Zero.

Now the time has come to build the Saint Nicholas National Shrine at World Trade Center. AHEPA and its affiliated organizations, the Daughters of Penelope, Sons of Pericles, and Maids of Athena, will support the campaign to build the Saint Nicholas National Shrine by raising funds during the next two years.

# St. George Parish Raises Funds to Rebuild St. Nicholas at Ground Zero Fresno, California

The 2015 Food Festival at the St. George Greek Orthodox Church in Fresno, California was used as a backdrop to raise funds in support of the Rebuild St. Nicholas Shrine at Ground Zero. The annual event is attended by approximately 25,000 residents of Fresno and adjoining central valley communities in late August. Recognizing the importance of the Rebuild St. Nicholas project, Father James Pappas along with the church's Board of Directors, Festival Committee, Chapter 151 of the Order of AHEPA, Leto Chapter 71 of the Daughters of Penelope, and Philoptochos Chapter 4008 participated in the fund raising event by staffing an Information and Education booth during the three day event. Kopi Sotiropulos, KMPH 26 Co Host of the Great Day TV program and member of AHEPA Chapter 151 provided some great public awareness of the project.

The Information Booth exhibited interior and exterior architectural renderings of the facility along with a continuously running video of the Shrine at Ground Zero from various angles. Handouts provided by the New York Archdiocese were used to disseminate information on the rebuilding effort.

A portion of admission fees combined with donation jars located at refreshment and food booths were collected. Portions of the proceeds were divided among the above mentioned organizations who will forward the funds through their respective national foundations. The remaining proceeds will be forwarded directly to the Rebuild St. Nicholas Project in New York on behalf of the St. George Parishioners of Fresno and adjoining communities.

## The Sons of Pericles on the Rebound!

For the first time in nearly thirty years, the Sons of Pericles held a group initiation in Fresno, adding five new members to the roster. While they joined the Stockton chapter, four of the initiates are from Fresno. They are Michael Salazar, Bassel Khoury, Jared Simonian and Alex Mazare. The fifth from Stockton is Anthony Tounou. Fresno now has five members. Three more are needed to reactivate Fresno chapter 137, which went inactive around 1983. Stockton chapter 207 is currently the only active chapter in District 21. The initiation was performed as part of the coffee hour at St. George Greek Orthodox Church in Fresno, hosted by Robert Sexton PSG and Helen Sexton PDG. Two of their grandsons are now Sons of Pericles.


# **AHEPA VETERANS REGISTRATION**

# AHEPA Medal for Military Service is awarded to all veterans in Honor of their service to the United States.

"The Mission of the Order of AHEPA Veterans Committee is to archive and recognize all veterans of the Order and Hellenic community through sound communication and publication. Furthermore, to conduct fund raising and philanthropic outreach through a cohesive, limited, yet well defined activity that reflects well on the Order of AHEPA and brings credit to the organization at large."

The AHEPA Medal for Military Service, approved by the 106th Congress, was presented to all AHEPA veterans present at the 34th Biennial Congressional Banquet, March 29, 2000. The Supreme Lodge then encouraged its districts and chapters to present this medal to its deserving veterans unable to attend this banquet. It is this committee's intent to register AHEPA Veterans and have the AHEPA Medal presented at appropriate events at the District and Chapter levels. Funds collected through this effort cover medal production and other administrative costs to include shipping. Remaining proceeds will be donated to the Wounded Warrior Program annually.

Eligibility requirement for AHEPA Medal for Military Service includes Honorable Service and Discharge. Service includes Active Duty, National Guard, or Reserve status of the United States Armed Forces. REGISTER ONLINE AT WWW.AHEPA.ORG. File a copy with your chapter Secretary after registration is complete. Medals are normally shipped in the fall and in time for Veteran's Day celebrations in November.

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
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
